I don't know if I was just so lucky to get the best teachers possible or if CSHS doesn't have bad teachers. In all my 6 classes (exactly, you only have 6 different classes in the Australian school system) I got along with my teachers really well and developed so much more than just a normal student-teacher relationship. It was more like a normal friendship in which we laughed together and talked about our life while or in between doing our exercises. So, I ended up playing drama and eating chocolate muffins every Friday morning with my awesome drama teacher. Chatting about the newest movie hits in the cinemas with my Film, TV and New Media teacher and laughing about random stuff. (Sadly) getting beaten in 'Finska' (a fun wooden toss game to play outside) by my sports and recreation teacher and working out in the school gym, together with the whole class. Getting creative and talk about God and the universe while working on our art projects with my visual art teacher, as well as having a great time together at our class excursion to an art gallery in Brisbane. Or having amazing girl chats with my legal studies teacher and our 'just-girls-class', whose lessons were more like a therapy session for everyone, improving the laws of the Australian government in the theoretical way in between.

All in all, you can just look forward to a school where you can be on eye level with your teachers and have a relaxed and respectful relationship while learning something for life in your classes.



Besides those great classes, there were many extracurricular activities and events I took part in: I joined the schools netball team that was an awesome and typical Australian experience. I met new people and played real matches against other schools. Sport events like 'cross country' or 'sports carnival' were fun days with the whole school where everyone (teachers, students, deputy principals etc.) were working together to get everything organised and put in action.

In which I participated and became first in high jump, I could join the district sports carnival at the

Campus of University of Sunshine Coast where all the qualified students went to, together with our sport teachers. It was a great chance to get to know new people from different grades of our school and cheer on each other.

Not to forget, the music night where students of all different classes have performed and made a fun and entertaining evening for everyone who came to watch. It was a great possibility to go there with friends to support the ones who were standing on stage. They were singing or playing an instrument, often together with their teachers. We've even had multiple songs of the school's own rock band.



And the most important thing: For every single event, the school makes sure the Internationals get involved and have a great time. Some of the exchange students were even participating in the music night and were standing on stage by themselves playing the violin.

But one of my highlight events was the seniors formal and graduation ceremony I could be part of. I've got perfectly included and had an awesome time, celebrating with my friends, schoolmates and teachers.



As I already mentioned, Alicia helped me with every single of my requests and things I've loved to do. Was it to join the netball team (even I've never played it before), to attend surfing lessons with the fantastic local 'Caloundra Surf School', to take tennis lessons at the Caloundra Tennis Club, or to start volunteering at 'Australia Zoo'. She has even driven me all the way to the zoo for my Interview. Or was it to help out at the famous Caloundra Street Markets at a 'Roesti booth' (a typical German food), or to put my idea of a cooking class with all the Internationals in action straight away (what brought us a fun time and delicious cinnamon rolls).

Everything worked out in the end. Even I mostly managed and organized it by myself after a while, the first step to get everything started came with Alicia and her amazing help. She always knew what to do, who to call, where to ask.


